Chairman McCasland called the meeting to order. James Kleinsasser led the Pledge of Allegiance.

A MOTION was made by Sue Dowell, SECONDED by Franklin McCasland to approve the minutes from the May 26, 2020 regular session as presented. MOTION carried with Cherry voting "aye", Dowell voting "aye" and McCasland voting "aye".

A MOTION was made by Mike Cherry, SECONDED by Sue Dowell to approve the Agenda. MOTION carried with Cherry voting "aye", Dowell voting "aye" and McCasland voting "aye".

Public Comments: None

NEW BUSINESS:

Jason Lamb, NMSU Extension Agriculture Agent, and Susann Mikkelson, NMSU Extension Family and Consumer Science Agent presented the Quarterly Report from the Quay County Extension Services. This report included programs and events from January through March, 2020. A copy of the report is attached to these minutes.

Justin Knight, along with Lucas Bugg, representing the Quay County Fair Board, presented three plans for planning of the 2020 Quay County Fair. Knight explained the fluidity of Public Health Orders are forcing

additional planning. Knight stated the carnival has been cancelled, and that will absolutely not change regardless of the changing Health Orders. Knight explained, the carnival staff had to know immediately, and the Fair Board could not make that commitment. Knight reported the Horse Show, which has been poorly attended for years, has also been cancelled. Knight presented the following three plans:

Plan A: Have a normal fair.

Plan B: Have a 3 day Junior Livestock show with only 4-H/FFA exhibits. No open exhibits permitted.

Plan C: Indoor 4-H/FFA exhibits, livestock show with species coming in for the day of their show and leave following the show.

Knight stated the rabbit show will be held virtually, due to a disease that's affecting rabbits throughout the state. Knight reported with Plan B and C, both would require strategic set-up scheduling and a "Premium Sale" due to the livestock leaving the arena the day they show.

County Manager Primrose stated he was on a conference call that included Jeff Witte, Secretary of Agriculture, and also has contacted Brian Moore, Co-Chair of the Governor's "Re-Open New Mexico Task Force". Primrose reported neither could provide any information regarding conducting County Fairs at this time.

Commissioners, Cherry, Dowell and McCasland thanked Knight for pursuing the best possible avenues to have a County Fair and offered 100% support of the Fair Boards decisions.

Quay County Sheriff, Russell Shafer, presented the Activity Report for the month of May, 2020. A copy of said Report is attached to these minutes.

Ellen White, Quay County Clerk, presented the 2020 Primary Election Results, along with tallied provisional ballots for seven voters and one provisional disqualified due to the voter not having declared a major political party. A MOTION was made by Mike Cherry, SECONDED by Sue Dowell to approve the Canvass of the 2020 Primary Election as presented. MOTION carried with Cherry voting "aye", Dowell voting "aye" and McCasland voting "aye". A copy is attached.

Larry Moore, Quay County Road Superintendent, gave the following report:

1. Road mileage verifications were conducted with NM Department of Transportation personnel on June 1st.
2. Quay Road BH is nearing completion with \$4,200.00 left unexpended.
3. On June 22, Quay Road AD will be fog sealed and complete the CAP Project before the end of this fiscal year. The road will be closed to the public for a short time.
4. The District 4 Traffic Engineer will be conducting a survey of the intersection of Quay Road AI and Hwy 54 as a result of Quay Counties concerns of the hazards at that location.

Commissioner Dowell thanked Moore for following up with the intersection and also for maintaining and fixing the shoulders on Quay Road AI that had crumbled away.

5. Crews have been maintaining and installing cattle guards throughout the County, as well as patching pot holes. Moore stated they will not be blading until there is adequate moisture.
6. Pacheco Construction should start working on Quay Road AR installing culvert pipe and rip rap on the inlets and outlets today. This will complete the CBDG Project.
7. Blade Reports were distributed.

Richard Primrose, Quay County Manager presented the following items for informational purposes:

1. The next meeting was set for July 2, due to the previously scheduled NMC Summer Conference. Since it has been cancelled, Primrose asked the Commissioners if they would prefer to move the meeting back to its normal scheduled time of June 22. The Commissioners agreed the 22nd of June would be best.

A MOTION was made by Sue Dowell SECONDED by Mike Cherry to approve the expenditures included in the Accounts Payable Report ending June 5, 2020. MOTION carried with Dowell voting "aye", Cherry voting "aye" and McCasland voting "aye".

Quarterly Report – January – March 2020

Beginning March 20th the Quay County Extension office was directed to work from home because of the COVID-19 outbreak. Many programs that were offered had to be cancelled. Employees were placed on a limited schedule and took turns covering the office with all employees working from home as much as possible on a regular 40 hour work week. All employees have adapted to offer many programs through social media and zoom formats including 4-H Club meetings, Fair Board meetings, a Statewide COVID-19 financial literacy program, 4-H food challenge, Cloverbud workshops, 4-H podcasts and the Egg to Chick program.

NMSU Cooperative Extension Service held two virtual meetings via Zoom to request that County Extension Agents begin seeking innovative ways to offer programs and services to constituents, anticipating that the COVID-19 Outbreak was going to cause further restrictions on in-person interaction. They also requested that Extension Agents and County offices reach out to their communities to offer any assistance in emerging community needs, such as possible food shortages and other needs. As such The FCS Agent reached out to the community assistance programs to inquire about needs in the community related to food shortages and food distribution, access to care and other services, etc. There were not any urgently emerging needs at the time, and the service providers appeared to have the resources they needed.

Agriculture

Sustainable Agriculture

A Bull Production Program was held at the Quay County fairground in conjunction with the Tucumcari Bull Sale. The NMSU Veterinarian, NMSU Beef Specialist, and the NMSU Livestock Specialist did presentations with the agricultural agent moderating the program. Sixty-five beef producers attended and learned about heritable traits and genetics in breeding, reproductive systems and how they function, trichaminosis testing, and results of the Tucumcari Bull test. Participants received continuing educational credits for certified Beef Quality Assurance producers and were served a meal sponsored by the New Mexico Beef Council Foundation.

The Tucumcari Bull Test Sale occurred at the Rex E. Kirksey Tucumcari Ag. Science center with about 100 bulls in the sale. Producers from New Mexico, Colorado, Oklahoma, and Texas participate in the cooperative program. Producers work closely with NMSU specialists to test bulls for the sale. The agent assists with organizing, advertising, and planning the event. The sale grosses over \$350,000 annually for producers and provides local buyers the opportunity to improve their herd genetics through obtaining high quality sires.

A Pruning workshop was held at the Rex E. Kirksey Agricultural Science center. The Agricultural agent set up and invited the NMSU horticulture specialist to present the program. Participants learned pruning techniques that would assist in backyard and small orchard situations. Fifteen people attended the training learning proper equipment, maintenance, and cleaning. Participants also gained an understanding of why pruning is important, proper cuts to make, branch selection, timing, and different techniques for various plants. Pruning techniques were demonstrated on several trees at the science center.

The Agricultural agent and the FCS agent have continually been working with the Table Top Cooperative in developing curriculum for the Beginning Farmers Program, Grants for funding the cooperative, a Commercial Kitchen, and updating the bylaws of the cooperative. Four meetings along with six committee meetings were held during January through March.

Quay County 4-H Program

4-H Trainings

The agricultural agent and program assistant conducted three "Working with Minors Trainings" for 4-H leaders, parents, and volunteers. The training is a new requirement this year and helps with protecting our 4-H youth. Five volunteers attended the training and gained knowledge on 4-H policies, bullying, harassment, and signs of abuse. Participants completed a written test in which all passed with 100 percent. Participants also are able to assist 4-Hers with events, travel, and programs through this process. There are plans to make this training available to 4-H leaders/coaches, parents and other volunteers online, so as to make it more accessible.

The welcome to 4-H workshop was held at the Cooperative Extension office on February 1st. The program introduces youth and parents to 4-H and informs them of expectations and opportunities 4-H offers. Youth are separated and the Quay County officer team teaches the beginning 4-H members about the pledge, motto, 4-H council, projects, and contests through interactive games. Parents learn about the policies, procedures, the 4-H newsletter, calendar of events, and programs available for 4-H members. The FCS Agent led the training for the 4-H youth; the County Director/Agricultural Agent led the training and information session for the parents. Nine parents and twelve youth participated in the training.

The FCS Agent proposed a podcast series project to the Quay County 4-H Council to be created, developed and published/broadcasted by a team of 4-H members. The 4-H Council approved this project and four 4-H members joined the podcast team for the Project. The Project team held its first meeting via Zoom on March 30th, and has continued meeting once to twice weekly since then.

The FCS Agent committed to assisting with training for Youth Counselors and Youth Counselors-in-training for the NMSU Cooperative Extension State 4-H Youth Getaway retreat held annually. The FCS Agent participated in two planning meetings to develop the agenda and curriculum for the 2020 training and orientation of the Youth Counselors and CITs.

4-H Shooting Sports

The Agricultural agent and Family and Consumer Science agent conducted a Shooting Sports Safety meeting that explained the shooting sports program to 4-H youth and parents in the county. The FCS Agent assisted with set-up, registration and with ensuring compliance forms were completed by all 4-H members and parents. Youth were taught gun and archery safety, range commands, process of checking out equipment, management, and filled out a code of conduct compliance form. Sixty-five people attended the training. Afterward the Archery range was setup with the help of parents and youth.

4-H Project Programs

The FCS Agent led a 4-H Sewing I workshops for 4-H members enrolled in Sewing I projects, per the recommendation of the Program Assistant. The Sewing I workshop had two attendees. Others enrolled with Sewing I projects were unable to attend. The FCS Agent also offered a Sewing II workshop for 4-H members enrolled in that project, but one 4-H member planning to attend was sick and the others were not available to attend. Future Sewing workshops will be held later in the year, after the add/drop deadline has passed, so that the workshops include anyone who adds programs.

The Program Assistant planned out Clovebud workshop activities, crafts, community service and snacks for the for the remainder of the year. The Program Assistant had prepared for the March 20 Cloverbud workshop on worms. A story about a worm finding a job would be used to talk about the actual work that worms provide for plants and soil. The community service component was coloring a picture to put on the residents' doors at Quail Ridge. The gummie worm snack was going to made from raspberry gelatin. Due to COVID-19 the workshop was cancelled.

Publications and Meetings

Several important meetings were conducted, the parent leader meeting which gains feedback from 4-H parents about the Quay County 4-H Program, the 4-H Finance Committee meeting which approves the year's budget, and the 4-H Shooting Sports meeting that organizes the program for the year. The program assistant prepared meals for the meetings which encourages participation and feedback.

The Program Assistant scheduled the dates for the Egg to Chick program with the Ag Agent. Then she made arrangements with all the third grade teachers in Tucumcari, Logan, San Jon and House to present the 5-week program. The school visits were scheduled to begin after Spring Break. Due to COVID-19 the series was cancelled. We then decided to host it through video on Facebook.

The Program Assistant worked on editing and updating the previous Fair Livestock Showers Brochure with the assistance of the Agricultural agent. Edits included ownership deadlines, tagging dates, fair dates and other changes made by the Fair Board. The Program Assistant also proofed the

text for errors and corrected them. The 2020 Brochure was then sent to the Fair Board to approve. The 2020 brochure will be completed when the Fair Sellers picture is received.

The Program Assistant worked on the 4-H Calendar of Events adding dates, events, contests, scheduled workshops, shooting sports practices, livestock tagging dates and other important information for 4-H families to easily access. This resource includes contact information for the Extension Office and staff. Each club is given a calendar for each club member.

Community and Economic Development

The FCS Agent assisted a local rancher with social media marketing and other marketing efforts, including researching and training the rancher in use of Facebook and Instagram for business, and starting a plan for selling locally raised, grassfed beef to local and regional restaurants.

The FCS Agent assisted the Quay County Fair Board Treasurer in resolving a question regarding the Employee Identification Number and IRS corporate tax status of the Fair Association. There were various documents with different EIN numbers in the records, and the Treasurer needed to identify the correct number associated with the Fair Association. The matter was resolved.

Home Economics

Due to the rapidly expanding work and related restrictions being imposed across the county, state and region related to the COVID-19 pandemic, the FCS Agent determined there was a need for information on how and where to get financial assistance, and to preserve personal finances in various ways. The FCS Agent worked with the NMSU College of ACES FCS Extension Specialist to organize and develop a four-part virtual workshop series called "Financially Navigating the COVID-19 Outbreak." The series included a broad variety of topics, including how to access federal and state financial assistance resources, information about the proposed stimulus money being offered (as it unfolded), how to best manage personal finances, prioritize bills and expenses, and save money (including avoiding over-buying to stock up), how to defer mortgage, auto and other payments without penalty, tips and information on saving and investing, and other related topics. The series was planned, organized and promoted in late March to be offered in early April.

The FCS Agent participated in and assisted with a number of NMSU Extension Quay County 4-H meetings, including the parent/leader training, the 4-H Finance Committee meeting, and the 4-H Shooting Sports meeting that organizes the program for the year.

A Kitchen Creations Cooking School series had been previously scheduled for Quay County Cooperative Extension to host in March and April, and the FCS Agent worked with the retired FCS Agent and the Kitchen Creations Program Specialist to develop content for the series and promote it during the month of February. This included creating and distributing flyers, promoting it through social media and promotion in the local media. The FCS Agent wrote and distributed a press release to the local media and was interviewed on both local radio stations about Kitchen Creations and how to participate in the classes.

The FCS Agent attended the Conchas Dam and Forrest Extension Club meetings in February and gave a presentation on Caring for Aging Skin at each meeting. The FCS Agent also led a discussion with the Club leaders and members during each meeting about their goals, their interests for future

programming and their interest in assisting with starting a new Extension Club in Tucumcari as well as recruiting club members for their own clubs.

The FCS Agent volunteered to serve on the Quay County Health Council's annual audit committee/working group. The FCS Agent convened two audit committee/working group meetings in March to conduct the annual audit of the financial and related records for the Health Council. The FCS Agent participated in and assisted in facilitating the Quay County 4-H Officer workshop planning meeting with the County Director. The planning meeting was held to plan a new officer training workshop for 4-H prospective officers and leaders.

The FCS Agent and the Quay County Extension Association President presented to seniors at the Quay County Senior Center in March regarding the possibility of starting a new Extension Club in Tucumcari, through the Senior Center. The FCS Agent and President led small-group discussions with groups of seniors during the lunch service. These sessions reached over 25 seniors, and interest in starting an Extension club was expressed by ~10 participants.

The FCS Agent provided pressure canner safety checks for two Quay County constituents, inspecting four pressure canner lids and testing five pressure canner gauges. One gauge needed replacing and one lid needed all new gaskets and seals.

The FCS Agent met with the Program Coordinator for the Foster Grandparent Program at the Quay County/Tucumcari Senior Center to discuss offering FCS programs to foster grandparents and other seniors through the Center. A list of 6-8 program topics were identified to be covered in monthly lectures or discussions, to begin in March. The concept of starting an Extension Club in Tucumcari through the Senior Center.

The Program Assistant attended planning meetings and prepared a booth for the Maze of Life event. She contacted two other organizations that also scheduled to attend Maze of Life with booths. The Program Assistant researched information about stress for a booth presentation. She designed the booth layout, prepared handouts (slime recipe), hands-on activities (made stress balls from balloons) and a brief presentation for the students. This event was geared for high school and college students. Unfortunately, due to COVID-19, the event was cancelled.

Strong Seniors Stay Young classes were held during February and March twice weekly. The classes are taught with the instructor at Mesa lands and teaches mobility and stretching exercise for seniors. Classes were cancelled after March 17 due to COVID-19 directives received from the Governor. The Program Assistant sent Remind text messages to participants, posted on Facebook and requested the radio station to announce the cancelled classes.

Professional Development

The FCS Agent and the Agriculture Agent attended the 2020 NMSU Extension Annual In-service held at NMSU College of Agriculture, Consumer and Environmental Sciences in Las Cruces in mid-January. The NMSU College of ACES Cooperative Extension 2025 Strategic plan was highlighted during the In-service. The FCS Agent participated in lectures, educational workshops and discussions on topics such as health and fitness programs, tools and innovative programming in Family and Consumer Science, behavior health and wellness, economic development, resilience in NM

Agriculture, STEM education and new technology in 4-H programming, using innovative media, and program development and evaluation. The FCS Agent also participated in a meeting of the Nm Extension Family and Consumer Science professionals (NEAFCS Association) held just prior to the In-service, in which professional development opportunities for FCS agents and other business was discussed and decided. The FCS Agent joined the professional association and volunteered to assist on a committee to develop a NMSU-centered health and exercise curriculum that will replace a national program the agents presently use, at quite an expense. The agricultural agent gained information on 2025 Strategic plan, behavior health and wellness, hemp production, plant sample submission, using innovative media, program development and evaluation, and agricultural marketing. The agent also attended the New Mexico Association of Agricultural Agents meeting and golf tournament. Where the agent encouraged other agent to become more active in the National association.

The County Director attended the Association of Counties during the 2020 legislative secession in Santa Fe and met with local legislators, participated in the Extension Affiliate meetings, and attended the governor's speech on the legislature. The agent gained knowledge on NMSU recruitment efforts, legislative bills important to NMSU and agriculture, and training for County Directors.

The FCS Agent attended the NMSU College of ACES Cooperative Extension 4-H New Agent Orientation in Las Cruces on Feb. 11th and 12th. The orientation covered some of the basics of the 4-H program, including project areas and topics, as well as some updates on technology being developed and integrated into 4-H programming, and specific training on the requirements around and methods for tagging and tattooing livestock for showing.

The FCS Agent scheduled and attended one-on-one training with the NMSU College of ACES IT personnel. The training consisted of introductory training on updating the Quay County Cooperative Extension web site, policies, protocols and practices for posting on social media and the web site, and introductory training on working with podcasting software and other software to help expand the reach of Cooperative Extension programs in Quay County.

The FCS Agent scheduled and participated in training with the Program Assistant and an NMSU FCS Extension specialist on how to conduct basic evaluation and outcomes-based evaluation on programs offered virtually (through Zoom, social media and other mediums).

Administrative

A day long Civil rights file day was held to update the federal civil rights files. The civil rights files are a requirement for federal funding and Civil Rights, Equal Employment Opportunities, and Americans with Disabilities compliance. All staff work together to complete the task and systematically get the files up to date.

Total personal contacts by staff at the Quay County Extension Service for January – March 2020 was 4695. Social Media contacts was 21,663 for a total 26,356.


Quay County Fair-Board 2020 Proposals


