

BE IT REMEMBERED THE HONORABLE BOARD OF QUAY COUNTY COMMISSIONERS met in regular session the 12th day of October, 2020 at 9:00 a.m. in the Quay County Commission Chambers, Tucumcari, New Mexico, for the purpose of taking care of any business that may come before them.

Chairman McCasland called the meeting to order. Lucas Bugg led the Pledge of Allegiance.

A MOTION was made by Mike Cherry, SECONDED by Sue Dowell to approve the minutes from the September 28, 2020 regular session as presented. MOTION carried with Cherry voting "aye", Dowell voting "aye" and McCasland voting "aye".

Public Comments:

Kathy Elliot, Lobbyist from Clinton D. Harden & Associates provided the NM Counties list of Legislative Priorities. Elliot said she would be emailing the list to the Commissioners and return for further dialog as the list often is not a representation of the needs of rural New Mexico, yet gets the most attention as a result of the efforts of the metropolitan areas.

Elliot explained the upcoming sixty day session will likely be closed to the public, due to COVID-19 Public Health Orders. Her team of Lobbyist is currently seeking personal cell phones and emails of Legislators to assist in contacting them during the session.

NEW BUSINESS:

Vickie Gutierrez, Dr. Dan C. Trigg Memorial Hospital Administrator request approval of the 1st and 2nd Quarter Mill Levy and GRT Payments from the County in the amounts of \$275,000.00 each. A MOTION

was made by Sue Dowell, SECONDED by Mike Cherry to approve both payments as requested. MOTION carried with Dowell voting "aye", Cherry voting "aye" and McCasland voting "aye".

Gutierrez thanked the County for their partnership in allowing the Presbyterian Health Care Services to conduct a drive-through flu vaccination clinic at the Quay County Fairgrounds. Primrose stated he heard from a lot of citizens it was a well conducted and appreciated event for the community.

Brenda Bishop, Quay County Health Council Coordinator presented the Annual Report of the Health Council. A copy of the Report is attached to these minutes.

Renee Hayoz, Presbyterian Medical Services Administrator presented the monthly RPHCA Report from the Quay County Family Health Center. Hayoz informed the public PMS will be hosting a drive-through COVID-19 screening for anyone interested on Friday, October 16th at the Health Center. They ask that interested clients call ahead to pre-register. The time set is from 9:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. Hayoz said 50 residents have signed up so far.

Commissioner Dowell asked Hayoz if PMS has any dental services they provide in New Mexico. Hayoz stated some clinics do, however most don't due to funding. Hayoz said PMS is aware of the situation in Quay County that may arise regarding dental care and have opened dialog to discuss it.

Commissioner Dowell asked Hayoz if their Clinic is providing any OBGYN services. Hayoz said they are not currently providing that type of service. Dowell asked Hayoz to voice concerns over the lack thereof for our citizens.

On behalf of Larry Moore, Quay County Road Superintendent, Primrose requested the following items be approved and provided the road updates:

What do these successes mean to you?

Teen suicide attempts down 38% (Highschool) and 11% (Middle school) since 2015

Diabetes Self-management Education: Sizable majority of patients who successfully completed the program lowered glucose levels enough to predict fewer complications.

Obesity Rate Among Quay County Adults

decreased since 2011 by 32%. Adults meeting physical activity recommendations has increased by 7%.

Overall more effective use of available resources through community partnerships coordinated by the Health Council.


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Quay County Health Council Working For A Healthier Community 2019-2020 Program Accomplishments

Building Council Capacity and Sustainability

- Completed a SWOT Analysis and Community Health Improvement Plan in May
- Began Implementation of Plan in July
- Currently 71 members from 34 members in January 2018
- Successfully moved all meetings to Zoom as a response to COVID-19
- Currently have 9 committees working on a variety of health issues and projects





Increasing Physical Activity



- Tenth Annual Fun Run had 132 walkers/runners and 65 volunteers.
 \$2100 received in donations
- Museum Scavenger Hunt had 210 participants and most went to both museums
- Marked and advertised new walking route
- Working with Friends of 5-mile park to identify walking paths
- Walk with a Dog Activity with 28 participants and 7 volunteers
- Because of COVID 19 Created short videos advertising places to walk and exercises to do

Community Survey on the Affects COVID-19 on Families in April and May

35% felt they were getting less physical activity

73% did not get the recommended amount of physical activity per day

30% felt that their diet was less healthy

65% were not eating the minimum amount of vegetables per day

72% were not eating the minimum amount of fruit per day

43% found it difficult to find healthy food and 39% found it difficult to prepare it

52% felt that their mental health was worse since Social Distancing Orders started

Using our Social Media pages, a team of members created posts to address issues brought out in the survey. The committee also worked on posts of resources and changes in how people access resources due to COVID-19. Tips for teaching kids at home and self-care were also posted. With a goal of reaching young families with local information we broaden our Social Media and by adding a New Platform in Instagram.



Videos have also been made on easy healthy dishes and utilizing more fruits and vegetables.



Assisted Presbyterian Healthcare Services complete a Community Health Improvement Plan for Dan C Trigg Memorial Hospital. Worked to identify stake holders and hosted 2 community meetings to gain information. Agreed to help with implementation of the plan in 4 major areas: Behavioral Health, Social Determinants of Health, Access to Care, and Healthy Eating/Active Living.

During one of the sessions, we learned that there was a need for information on community resources. The Council has at least one resource presentation at each meeting. A committee worked over a year to contact resources and put together a comprehensive regional directory with over 200 entries.

Resource Directory is currently being distributed.
