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Press Release – July 30, 2024

Pursuant to 1-4-28, NMSA 1978, between every Primary and General Election, state law requires the Secretary of State to send a notice to all voters who have been identified as having possibly moved without updating their Voter Registration. To comply with the National Voting Rights Act (NVRA) and state law, the State will be sending a voter address confirmation postcard to 680 voters in Quay County who have been identified as having possibly moved and did not update their Voter Registration. These postcards are slated to be sent to voters within the week, and no later than August 7th.

Voters who receive the voter address confirmation postcard can take the following actions to remain a registered voter in our county:

- 1) Complete the postcard and return it to the County Clerk
- 2) Visit nmvote.org to update their Voter Registration online; or request a paper registration form from the County Clerk's Office.

In Addition, New Mexico is a member of the Multi-State Electronic Registration Center which identifies voters who have possibly moved out of State by cross-checking Voter Registration files with Motor Vehicle Divisions.

An outreach mailer was mailed on July 29th to voters who may have been identified on this comparison. Instructions on how to cancel a registration and/or update your information is also included in this letter.

Remember it's crucial to keep your voter records current. We strongly urge you to check your registration at nmvote.org. You can update your info online, or you can come into the County Clerk's Office!

The Absentee Portal at nmvote.org for the public to request a mailed ballot for the 2024 General Election will be available on August 5th. Applications can be submitted through this portal or by requesting one from the County Clerk's Office.
