BE IT REMEMBERED THE HONORABLE BOARD OF QUAY COUNTY COMMISSIONERS met in regular session the 27<sup>th</sup> day of March, 2017 at 9:00 a.m. in the Quay County Commission Chambers, Tucumcari, New Mexico, for the purpose of taking care of any business that may come before them.

Chairman Franklin McCasland called the meeting to order. Jay Cammack led the audience in the Pledge of Allegiance.

A MOTION was made by Sue Dowell, SECONDED by Mike Cherry to approve the minutes from the March 13, 2017 regular session as printed. MOTION carried with Cherry voting "aye", McCasland voting "aye", and Dowell voting "aye".

A MOTION was made by Mike Cherry SECONDED by Sue Dowell to approve the Agenda as presented. MOTION carried with Cherry voting "aye", Dowell voting "aye", McCasland voting "aye".

#### PUBLIC COMMENTS:

Gail Houser, Tucumcari Main Street Director informed the Board of Commissioners that the City Commissioners have approved the Tucumcari Metropolitan Redevelopment Plan for the downtown area of Tucumcari. The plan is available at City Hall. Houser stated having this plan in place will allow the City to pursue future funding for infrastructure projects over the next decade.

Chairman McCasland called the Public Hearing to order for the purpose of closing out CDBG Project #14-C-RS-I-01-G-01. Time noted 9:05 A.M.

Darla Munsell, CDBG Coordinator presented a brochure to those in attendance that outlined the project that totaled \$1,131,396.74. Munsell reported the closing documents will be hand delivered to Santa Fe this Wednesday.

Public Hearing closed. Time noted 9:10 A.M.

ONGOING BUSINESS: NONE

Russell Braziel, Tucumcari Rawhide Days volunteer and coordinator requested approval of use of the north side of the exhibit center and the show ring during the May5-6 Rawhide Days event without the fee normally associated with the rental. Braziel said the committee will be providing all required insurance for use of the facility. A MOTION was made by Sue Dowell, SECONDED by Mike Cherry to approve use of the facility without fees. MOTION carried with Dowell voting "aye", Cherry voting "aye" and McCasland voting "aye".

Donald Adams, Quay County Fire Marshall requested approval of the PERA Applications for the following Quay County Fire Departments:

- 1. Forrest Rural Conservancy District
- 2. Jordan Rural Conservancy District

A MOTION was made by Mike Cherry, SECONDED by Franklin McCasland to approve the Applications as presented. MOTION carried with Cherry voting "aye", McCasland voting "aye" and Dowell "Abstained". Copies are attached and made a part of these minutes.

Adams requested approval of FY 2016-2017 Proclamation implementing a "Burn Ban" outside the municipalities in Quay County. Adams stated that when conditions improved, the burning could be revisited and the ban lifted. A MOTION was made by Sue Dowell, SECONDED by Mike Cherry to approve said Proclamation. MOTION carried with Dowell voting "aye", Cherry voting "aye" and McCasland voting "aye". A copy is attached and made a part of these minutes.

Chairman McCasland requested approval of FY 2016-2017 Resolution No. 43; A Resolution of the Board of Quay County Commissioners, Declaring it's Official Intent in Rescission of Resolution No. 2016-2017 No. 27.

Commissioner Dowell thanked McCasland for bringing forth the Resolution. Dowell stated it was unfortunate that the Commissioners had been misrepresented by Mr. Cameron following the rescission of the original Resolution.

Commissioner Cherry said he believed passage of this Resolution is redundant and not necessary. Cherry said this project is between the Contractor and a private landowner and not the business of the County. Furthermore stating he feels this type of action could lead other developers to believe the Commissioners support of future projects might be negative.

Chairman McCasland replied the Board of County Commissioners has always evaluated each project presented to them based on their own merit and cause for the County. Quay County has a

long standing support to wind and oil exploration and development McCasland said he was elected to represent the people of Quay County and is being their overwhelming voice.

Commissioner Cherry agreed by saying that's exactly why Resolution No. 27 was rescinded but still believes Resolution No. 43 is not necessary.

A MOTION was made by Sue Dowell, SECONDED by Franklin McCasland to approve Resolution No. 43. Motion carried with Dowell voting "aye", McCasland voting "aye" and Cherry voting "nay". A copy of said Resolution is attached and made a part of these minutes.

Larry Moore, Quay County Road Superintendent, gave the following report:

- 1. Quay County is in receipt of the 2016-2017 LGRF funding for projects. The amounts are as follows: CAP \$253,004.00; COOP \$124,483.00; SCHOOL BUS \$106,169.00.
- 2. Quay Road 63 is complete with final paperwork to be delivered to Santa Fe on Wednesday.
- 3. Moore has a meeting with the Secretary and Deputy Secretary of Transportation this coming Thursday. Moore said they will be attending the NMAC Annual Conference in Taos and he wants to share some of the concerns of the Departments with them so they aren't blindsided by questions and concerns.
- 4. 2017-2018 LGRF projects have been submitted to area director John Herrera.
- 5. Moore has requested 14,080 cubic yards of millings for the Route 66 project near San Jon.

Chairman McCasland asked Moore if he had considered asking the Secretary of Transportation to begin lifting requirements for categorical exclusions on existing maintained roads in the county. Moore said that was at the top of his list.

Commissioner Dowell asked Moore to visit with them about the continued problem of semi-trucks using Quay Road AI as a main thoroughfare. Dowell said she understands Quay County, alone cannot detour these trucks, but perhaps the State could assist or tell us who can help.

Patsy Gresham, Quay County Treasurer joined the meeting. Time noted 9:25 A.M.

6. Moore reported crews are busy with clean-up projects due to the recent high winds.

Richard Primrose, Quay County Manager presented the following items of correspondence:

- 1. Presented the monthly Gross Receipts Tax Report for March. Primrose indicated revenue is increased over last year due to construction. He reported that the Hwy 54 bridge project should be going out for bid this next week which will keep construction receipts on the increase.
- 2. Registration for the NMAC Annual Conference is now open for the event being held in Taos, NM the week of June 20-23, 2017.
- 3. NMAC will be hosting a Legislative District Meeting in Tucumcari at Mesalands Community College on April 19.

Chairman McCasland called the Indigent Claims Board portion of the meeting to order. Time noted 9:35 a.m.

## FY 2016-2017 QUAY COUNTY

## **PROCLAMATION**

**WHEREAS**, Quay County passed Ordinance No. 27 authorizing the issuance of Burn Ban Proclamation and

**WHEREAS**, Quay County as with other counties in Eastern New Mexico and West Texas, has experienced a prolonged dry spell with very little moisture; and

WHEREAS, Quay County had determined, based upon current drought indices published by the National Weather Service for one week prior to this date as well as moisture predictions for the drought conditions in Quay County; and

WHEREAS, Quay County has suffered and experienced grass fires and is aware that adjacent and/or adjoining counties have suffered grass fires; and

WHEREAS, Quay County believes that it is in the best interest of the residents of the unincorporated areas of Quay County to impose a County-wide ban on any outdoor open flame, with the exception of propane and charcoal barbecue grills with covers; and

WHEREAS, Quay County has prohibited smoking except in enclosed buildings, within vehicles equipped with ashtrays, and on paved or surfaced roads, developed recreation sites, or while stopped in an area at least three feet in diameter that is barren or cleared of all flammable material.

**WHEREAS**, Quay County has prohibited fireworks per Ordinance 27, Section 2E, Sections 3-8 and Section 11.

**NOW THEREFORE** the County Commissioners of Quay County, which is the governing body of Quay County, pursuant to its powers under Ordinance No. 27, to provide for the safety, reserve the health, promote the prosperity and improve the moral, order, comfort and convenience of Quay County and its inhabitants hereby proclaim that from this day forward, until otherwise modified or rescinded, that an open fire ban, with the exception of Quay County Fire Departments training, propane and charcoal barbecue grills with covers, shall be imposed throughout the unincorporated areas of Quay County. These restrictions will go into effect Monday, March 27, 2017 until it is determined by the Board of County Commissioners that the fire danger has passed on non-municipal, non-federal and non-tribal lands in Quay County.

Any person charged with a violation of Ordinance No. 27 shall be cited into the Magistrate Court of Quay County and penalties attest per Section 13 of Ordinance 27.

This Proclamation shall be enforced by any Quay County Sheriff's Deputy, or any State certified law enforcement officer.

IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, PASSED AND ADOPTED this 27th day of March 2017.

## **RESOLUTION NO. 43**

## A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF QUAY COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, DECLARING ITS OFFICIAL INTENT IN RESCISSION OF RESOLUTION 2016-2017 NO. 27.

WHEREAS, Quay County (the "County") in the State of New Mexico; and

WHEREAS, the Quay County Board of Commissioners is the governing body of the County; and

**WHEREAS**, the Quay County Board of Commissioners rescinded Resolution 2016-2017; No. 27 on February 13, 2017 citing overwhelming public opposition to the Deep Borehole Field Test proposed by Federal Services and DOSECC Exploratory Services; and

WHEREAS, the decision to rescind Resolution No. 27 by the Commissioners was an official gesture removing support for the proposal to drill a deep crystalline basement rock borehole for the United States Department of Energy by ENERCON Federal Services due to overwhelming opposition by the Citizens in Quay County; and

WHEREAS, ENERCON representative, Chip Cameron, was quoted in a national nuclear industry media outlet, the Exchange Monitor, in a March 10, 2017 article titled "Borehole Bidders on the Clock to Show Community Engagement" as follows: "The previous rescission {of Resolution No. 27} was not an indication that {the Quay County Board of Commissioners} do not support the project. They just want more information;" and

WHEREAS, the people of Quay County have requested the County to correct this misrepresentation by ENERCON to the DOE and others, and declare that their intention in rescinding Resolution No. 27 was in direct opposition to the Deep Borehole Field Test proposed in Quay County;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE QUAY COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF QUAY COUNTY, NEW MEXICO, to declare the official intent in the rescission of Resolution 27 was to indicate this body's withdrawal of support of the deep borehole field test proposed by the DOE and their contractors because of overwhelming public opposition.
